Mark schemes are prepared by the Lead Assessment Writer and considered, together with the relevant questions, by a panel of subject teachers. This mark scheme includes any amendments made at the standardisation events which all associates participate in and is the scheme which was used by them in this examination. The standardisation process ensures that the mark scheme covers the students' responses to questions and that every associate understands and applies it in the same correct way. As preparation for standardisation each associate analyses a number of students' scripts: alternative answers not already covered by the mark scheme are discussed and legislated for. If, after the standardisation process, associates encounter unusual answers which have not been raised they are required to refer these to the Lead Assessment Writer.

It must be stressed that a mark scheme is a working document, in many cases further developed and expanded on the basis of students' reactions to a particular paper. Assumptions about future mark schemes on the basis of one year's document should be avoided; whilst the guiding principles of assessment remain constant, details will change, depending on the content of a particular examination paper.

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General guidance on the use of the mark scheme

Questions are marked out of 40 according to the banding provided on the following pages and question-specific mark bands in the mark schemes for individual questions.

Examiners should be positive in their marking, rewarding points that candidates **do** make rather than penalising them for omissions.

All candidates' work should be marked against the criteria, not against a notional 'perfect' answer or against the last script marked. The different strengths and weaknesses of each script should always be weighed against the generic mark bands and the mark scheme for individual questions.

As well as using all of the five mark bands as appropriate, examiners should use the full range of marks available within any one mark band. If an answer is described exactly by a particular band, it should be placed at the top of that band. When an answer fulfils all the criteria of a mark band and has several qualities of the mark band above, then it should be placed in the next mark band. Marks will be awarded holistically according to the criteria and not according to an assumed numerical system based on the bullet points given for guidance.

Use of the Mark Bands

Question 01 is a standard question to provide context for the work studied for Section A and success with this question is in terms of providing all aspects of the question asked. For all of the other questions the quality of the responses will be differentiated with respect to the clarity of communication and the bands are organised to reflect this.

Assessment Objectives

AO1: "Recall, select and communicate their knowledge and understanding of drama to generate, explore and develop ideas"

(20% of total examination)

AO1 is assessed in Questions 01, 02, 05, 07, 09 and 11.

AO3: "Analyse and evaluate their own work and that of others using appropriate terminology" (20% of total examination)

AO3 is assessed in Questions 03, 04, 06, 08, 10 and 12.

Quality of written communication

There is no separate mark allocation for Quality of Written Communication (QWC), which is contained within Assessment Objective 1:

"Recall, select and communicate their knowledge and understanding of drama to generate, explore and develop ideas"

and Assessment Objective 3:

"Analyse and evaluate their own work and that of others using appropriate terminology."

Written answers must be expressed in continuous prose. Wherever communication of the response is clear the full range of marks is available.

SECTION A PRACTICAL WORK COMPLETED DURING THE COURSE

Question 1



Choose a piece of practical coursework in which you were involved as actor \mathbf{or} designer \mathbf{or} technician. You must answer questions 01 - 04 using the same practical work and the same selected skill.

Describe what the piece was about; state the period, style and genre of the piece, the performance space, your target audience and any technical or design elements used. You should state whether your contribution was as actor **or** designer **o**r technician.

In meeting the demands of AO1 'to recall, select and communicate their knowledge and understanding of drama to generate, explore and develop ideas' expect candidates' answers to include:

- a description of the practical coursework piece, which may be scripted or unscripted a statement of:
- the period
- the style
- the genre of the piece
- the performance space used and its configuration
- the target audience
- any technical and/or design elements used if applicable
- the candidate's chosen skill as actor, designer or technician.

Explain what specific skills you applied to this piece of coursework. Give details of the acting **or** design **or** technical skills that you personally used.

(10 marks)

In meeting the demands of AO1 'to recall, select and communicate their knowledge and understanding of drama to generate, explore and develop ideas' expect candidates' answers to:

- focus on their own contribution to the piece of coursework
- include one selected skill, either acting or a design aspect or a technical aspect
- give relevant details of this selected skill

The focus for this question is an explanation of drama skills used by the candidate and these should reflect the same skills awarded for controlled assessment practical options.

A response that explains preparation work with no reference to acting skills or group activities will be self-limiting and is unlikely to reach the clarity of a Band 2 response.

Responses will be credited according to the clarity with which candidates explain their skills **and** the usefulness of references to their application to the work.

A successful response to this question can refer to the rehearsal and/or performance and will explain the skills applied.

Analyse how you used the rehearsal process to improve your acting **or** design **or** technical skills. Give details of **at least one** specific occasion during the preparation process when you improved your own individual skills.

(10 marks)

In meeting the demands of AO3 'to analyse and evaluate their own work and that of others using appropriate terminology' expect candidates' answers to include:

- reference to at least one specific occasion when improvement was made with regard to their selected skill
- an analysis of how the specific individual skills improved during the preparation process

The focus of this question is on the preparation process undertaken by the candidate. If there is a collective, group approach taken or if techniques and exercises are included without specific application it is unlikely that these responses will reach the clarity required of a Band 2 response.

Responses will be credited according to the clarity with which candidates analyse how their skills improved **and** to how useful the references are to at least one specific occasion in the preparation process.

Evaluate your personal success in demonstrating your acting **or** design **or** technical skills in the final performance. Give specific details of **at least one** moment from the final performance to support your answer.

(10 marks)

In meeting the demands of AO3 'to analyse and evaluate their own work and that of others using appropriate terminology' expect candidates' answers to include:

- identification of at least one particular moment of success
- an evaluation of the candidate's contribution to the final performance

A successful response to this question will sustain focus on the performance event; 'anything from a workshop presentation to a full-scale public performance can be used, although more substantial pieces will give candidates more scope to do themselves justice'.

Responses that discuss the rehearsal process or write about collective success are unlikely to reach the clarity of a Band 2 response.

Responses will be credited according to the clarity with which candidates evaluate their success **and** to how useful the references are to performance moments.

Choose **one** extract from a play you have studied and performed during your course. Your answer to both parts of this question should focus on your acting skills.

Explain how you developed your acting skills during rehearsals to create a style of performance appropriate to your studied play. Give details of your research, rehearsal and any other preparation work relevant to your own role in the play.

(20 marks)

In meeting the demands of AO1 'to recall, select and communicate their knowledge and understanding of drama to generate, explore and develop ideas' expect candidates' answers to include:

- identification of text and of extract
- indication of their role in the extract and of their interpretation
- reference to their research, rehearsal and other preparation work
- the development of their own acting skills in rehearsal in relation to their specified style

The focus for this question is an explanation of the development of acting skills used by the candidate. The selected extract should inform the material discussed and any exercises or techniques should be both relevant and securely applied to the candidate's role in the play.

A response that explains preparation work or group activities without clear application will be self limiting and is unlikely to reach the clarity required of a Band 2 response.

Responses will be credited according to the clarity with which candidates explain the way their skills were developed in rehearsal **and** the usefulness of references to preparation work.

Explain how you developed your own ideas and applied your skills to the extract of your studied play. Give specific details of your research and other preparation work.

(20 marks)

In meeting the demands of AO1 'to recall, select and communicate their knowledge and understanding of drama to generate, explore and develop ideas' expect candidates' answers to include:

- identification of text and of extract
- identification of the selected skill of either lighting, sound, set design, costume, make-up properties, stage management, masks or puppets.
- reference to their research, rehearsal and other preparation work
- the development of their own design or technical ideas

The focus for this question is on an explanation of the development of skills relating to the candidate's application of a selected design or technical aspect to an extract of their studied play.

Responses will be credited according to the clarity with which candidates explain the way their ideas were developed in the rehearsal period **and** the usefulness of references to the extract.

Choose **one** live theatre production you have seen during your course and select **one** scene or section of the play where the acting was particularly effective.



Describe in detail the ways in which **at least one** of the actors applied their acting skills in your selected scene or section. Give details of the vocal and physical skills demonstrated by **one or more** of the actors in this part of the play.

Candidates are required to produce a personal response' to the acting skills witnessed by them 'in a 'live' theatre production seen during their course.

In meeting the demands of AO1 'to recall, select and communicate their knowledge and understanding of drama to generate, explore and develop ideas' expect candidates' answers to include:

- identification of the production seen and the venue
- identification of at least one effective actor
- identification of one specific scene or section
- description of the application of vocal and physical skills

Responses will be credited according to the clarity with which candidates describe the acting skills **and** to how useful the references are to a specific scene or section.

Analyse why you consider the acting in this scene or section to be so effective. You should refer to particular moments from the performance to support your analysis.

(20 marks)

Candidates must have studied the play from a practical point of view and should be able to show their knowledge and understanding of the way in which the text was realised in the production.

In meeting the demands of AO3 'to analyse and evaluate their own work and that of others using appropriate terminology' expect candidates' answers to include some of the following:

- reference to particular moments from the performance
- identification of specific acting skills from the performance
- analysis of the effectiveness of the acting

Candidates who describe the acting rather than analyse the effectiveness of the performance are unlikely to achieve a Band 2 response.

Responses will be credited according to the clarity with which candidates analyse the acting skills and to how useful the references are to particular moments from the performance.

Question 5

Choose **one** live theatre production you have seen during your course where **one** particular area of design **or** technical skill was particularly effective. You should focus on **one** of the following:

- lighting
- sound
- set design
- costume
- make-up
- properties (props).



Explain what your selected design **or** technical skill contributed to **one** specific scene or section of the production. You should refer to particular moments from the performance to support your answer.

(20 marks)

Candidates are required to produce a personal response to the design and/or technical skills witnessed by them in a 'live' theatre production seen during their course.

In meeting the demands of AO1 to recall, select and communicate their knowledge and understanding of drama to generate, explore and develop ideas expect candidates' answers to include:

- identification of the production seen and the venue
- identification of one area of design or technical skills that was effective (lighting, sound, set design, costume, make-up, properties, stage management, masks or puppets).
- identification of one scene or section
- explanation of the effectiveness of the selected design or technical skills

Candidates who do not give due attention to the skills of the designer or technician are unlikely to achieve a Band 2 response.

Responses will be credited according to the clarity with which candidates explain the selected skills in the performance **and** to how useful the references are to the skills of the designer or technician.

A sketch is very helpful in providing a context for the response but does not replace it.

(Production areas can include acting and/or any other design/technical elements)

(20 marks)

Candidates should be able to demonstrate the ability to evaluate the effectiveness of the skills presented and to demonstrate the ability to analyse and evaluate the effectiveness of the production as a whole.

In meeting the demands of AO3 'to analyse and evaluate their own work and that of others using appropriate terminology' expect candidates' answers to include:

- reference to the chosen scene or section from the production
- · identification of the selected area of design or technical skill in combination with other production areas
- · evaluation of how successfully the elements combined

Candidates who describe the performance rather than evaluate the combination of design/technical elements are unlikely to achieve a Band 2 response.

Responses will be credited according to the clarity with which candidates evaluate the success of their selected design/technical skill **and** to how useful the references are to how it combined with other areas.
